

- Sept 6<sup>th</sup> U.S. S. Ship Adventure came in.  
 .. 7<sup>th</sup> a large fire ashore 38 houses burnt down.  
 .. 11<sup>th</sup> the Adventure left the harbour.  
 .. 17<sup>th</sup> Steamer came in with the long expected June mail which had gone to Yokohama while we were in Chefoo.

Sept 18<sup>th</sup> Wright quarters.

.. 27<sup>th</sup> Court martial for the trial of William Webb seaman. minstrel entertainment a gay party on board dancing kept up until the small hours of night.

Oct 3<sup>rd</sup> U.S. S. Ship Hornet came in.

.. 4<sup>th</sup> U.S. S. Gunboat Kingdore came in.

.. 5<sup>th</sup> U.S. S. S. Co Steamer Alaska came in.

.. 6<sup>th</sup> the Salamas tender of Admiral Sir H. Kellet came in.

Oct 10<sup>th</sup> Admiral Kellet visited our ship.

.. 15<sup>th</sup> the English fleet left the harbor the Ocean homeward bound manned rigging and cheered off when she passed.

Oct 17<sup>th</sup> English consul came on board and received the usual salute.

Oct 20<sup>th</sup> <sup>1852</sup> great Japanese holiday, wrestling, processions, theatrical performance etc.

Nov 2<sup>nd</sup> U.S. S. Ship Orledge came in, the U. S. mail came in and brought us our railway orders for Yokohama.

Nov 3<sup>rd</sup> left for Yokohama.

.. 4<sup>th</sup> sighted Kosiki island, Utsi Sima, Taka Sima, Talkars island, mount Hornor, Cape Chick, a kuff sighted.

Nov 6<sup>th</sup> sighted Osima head.

.. 8<sup>th</sup> Utsi Sima, Rock island light. Struck by a squall sprung fore yard split fore top rail, came to anchor off Yokohama at 10 P.M. passed the English gunboat Silvia which came in shortly afterwards. the following men of war are in harbor, the Colorado, Flag ship and Idaho store ship, English Borussia and Silvia, Italian Vittorio Pisane, French Second, Prussian Lobold.

Nov 11<sup>th</sup> the Colorado left for Yaddo, the Lobold left the harbor, the Italian, English and Prussian. Captains paid us a visit also the American consul.

Nov 13<sup>th</sup> went up to Yaddo with the American minister on board and came to anchor about 6 miles off the
